
FAQs

Year 6-7 Transition Timeline: Guide for Parents

October 24 Year 6 Prospective Parent Events

An opportunity for year 6 families to visit Ponteland High School during our open morning and evening events.

31 October 24 Closing Date for Applications for School Places

Applications for secondary admissions must be submitted by 31st October to the council website.

1 March 25 Outcome of Application for School Places

Northumberland County Council (NCC) manages admissions on our behalf. Please contact NCC directly if you have queries about admissions. Inform NCC as soon as possible if you do not wish to take the place at Ponteland High School.

April 25 Welcome Letter and Pack

Following the offer of a place, year 6 parents receive a letter from the Headteacher and an information pack with all the dates and details about the transition process.

14 & 22 May 25 Tours of Ponteland High School for Year 6 Students

Year 6 families are invited to Ponteland High School for an after-school tour of the building and to meet the Senior Leadership team, the year 7 transition/pastoral team and the SEN team.

4 June 25 Sehgal Uniform Pop-Up Shop at Ponteland High School

Year 6 students and their family can visit Ponteland High School to try on and purchase uniform.

16-20 June 25 Year 6 'The Bee Week'

In their primary schools, year 6 students develop knowledge and understanding of bees that they apply on the transition days and in year 7 lessons in the autumn term.

2 July 25 Year 6 Parents' Information Evening

Year 6 students and parents have the opportunity to listen to a talk by the Headteacher, find out their Year 7 tutor group and meet their new Year 7 tutor.

3 & 4 July 25 Year 6 Transition Days at Ponteland High School

Year 6 students spend two full days at Ponteland High School experiencing lessons, lunch and finding out everything they need to know for September.

2 September 25 Year 7 First Day at Ponteland High School

Year 7 attend school for their first day. They spend the morning with tutors and then start lessons in the afternoon. Only Year 8 and Post-16 students are also present.

September 25 Year 7 Tutor Group Team Building Event at Plessey Woods

Each tutor group has a day filled with team building activities in order to get to know their classmates and tutor.

September 25 Year 7 Bee Showcase and Tutor Drop-In Evening

Year 7 parents have the opportunity to see all the work produced as part of the Bee Project in year 6 and year 7. Year 7 tutors are also available if parents have any queries.

November 25 Year 7 Subject Parents' Evening

Year 7 parents have the opportunity to speak to teachers about the progress of their child in their subjects.

Year 6 Transition Days

Here you will find all the practical information about the Y6 transition days that take place in the summer term at Ponteland High School.

Dates and Times: Thursday 3 July and Friday 4 July 2025, 9.00am-3.25pm



Drop off and pick up: Enter through the black gates next to the bus drop-off area (pictured). We respectfully ask that you do not accompany your child or come in via reception as we need your child to experience what it will be like in September. Once in school, we will direct your child to the assembly hall where we will register and direct students into their tutor groups.

Food: Available at break and lunchtime in the school hall. You can bring a packed lunch or have a school dinner. There's no need to choose in advance as menus for both days will be available via your child's primary school.

Uniform: Attend in current primary school uniform.

Equipment: Bring a bag, a water bottle and a pencil case.


Mobile phone: Allowed but must be on 'silent' and kept away in bags.

Medical Needs: If your child needs to have prescription medication administered in school on the transition days, please come into reception, speak to a member of staff and complete the appropriate forms.

In essence, we are asking you to tell us about your son/daughter; what are their interests and areas of expertise, what motivates them, what you love about them and anything else you feel it would be good for us to know.

These can be sent in the format of an email, a word-processed document, a PowerPoint, a piece of poetry, or even film. Please feel free to be creative and adding a photograph or two is really helpful in putting faces to names.

We love receiving them and Mr McElwee reads every one. The Pen Portraits are also shared with the relevant Pastoral Leader/Manager and Form Tutor so that they too get a head start in knowing their new students. It would be great if we could receive these by **mid-July** so that they can be shared with key staff before the summer break; feel free to start sending them whenever you feel able to.

Summer Holiday Project



We ask Year 6 students to participate in a summer transition task to create an independent project on a topic or theme of their choice.

Students can focus on one of the following:

a) research into an area of interest, such as a particular period of history, scientific discovery, novel/news item you have read or


fashion style

b) describe how to carry out and develop an area of expertise/skill, such as creating a

piece of art, playing a particular sport/musical instrument or how to construct a car

c) recount an activity you experienced over the summer with details of a holiday destination or new activity/culture you experienced

In September in Year 7, students get the opportunity to present the project to their form class using video, powerpoint, photographs, a display and/or a written report either individually or in small groups.



Frequently Asked Questions

What's the biggest difference between primary and secondary school?

Ponteland High School is probably a much bigger place than your primary school and you have to move around from lesson to lesson. We expect you to be more grown up and responsible but, don't worry, as there are plenty of people to support you. Year 7 students say that the biggest difference is that you need to get organised and the best way is to use your school planner.



Will I be with my friends from primary school?

We ask your primary teachers to provide names of 2-3 students that you know and work well with at primary school. These will not necessarily be your best friends: friendships often change over time and we encourage you to form new friendships when you start at Ponteland High School. There are

around 25 people in each tutor group and you will get to know your tutor group and your tutor before the summer holidays. Tutor time is only for a short period each day; you will then be completely mixed in your lessons. The vast majority of Year 7 students have developed a much wider social group by the end of Year 7. At breaks and lunchtimes, you will be able to socialise with your friends in the social area.

What will the lessons be like?

You will be given your timetable on the first day in September and find out your classes then. You have about ten subjects and you usually have one teacher for that subject. Lessons are in different classrooms so you do have to move around the school. You will get to use all of the specialist teaching facilities like the science laboratories, the technology rooms, the drama studio and the 4G pitch.

Can I bring my mobile phone to school?

You can bring your mobile phone to school. You don't need to hand it in, you just keep it in your bag on silent and don't look at it during the day.



How much homework will I get?

At first you only get a bit of homework but then it builds up to around one piece for each subject a week. It's usually due back in a week which is enough time to complete it. A good bit of advice is to set aside one hour after school each night and get it all done then. Some of the homework is set on Google Classroom. English, Maths and Science homework is set on 'Sparxs' and your teachers will show you how to use this.

What equipment do I need to bring in each day and what happens if I forget?

All you need to bring is your bag with your pencil case, planner, the books you need that day and a reading book. It's a good idea to bring a water bottle as well. In your pencil case, have two pens and pencils, a ruler and a rubber. You can bring highlighters and your own glue stick and other stationary if you want. Don't worry if you forget, you can ask a friend or the teacher or buy supplies in the school library.

What happens if I get lost?

You get given a map of the school on your first day but there are lots of teachers around to show you where to go. There are numbers on the doors and you get a tour on the first day as well. It can be a bit confusing at first but there's always someone going to the same class as you. For the first few weeks it's ok if you get lost and teachers are fine if you are a little bit late but they do expect that you will get used to it quite quickly!



What is lunch like?

There is always a wide variety of food to buy at break and lunchtime. If you prefer you can bring a packed lunch. Year 7s get to sit together so you can sit with your friends either in the dining hall or outside on the picnic tables. Your parents add money to your account through the school payment system and we scan your thumbprint to pay for the food.
